After the meeting had been duly called to order, the following Resolution was offered by Mr. Harting, and seconded by Mr. Patanian, to wit:

WHEREAS, the Rensselaer County Water and Sewer Authority (the “Authority”) has solicited bids for the installation of new mechanical screens at the Corliss sewage pump station to ensure effective sewer service to the Town of East Greenbush; and

WHEREAS, five bids were received, with O’Connell Electric Company, Inc. submitting the low bid of \$282,750.00; and

WHEREAS, H.V. LaBarba, P.E., the Authority’s consulting engineer, has reviewed such bids and the bidders’ experience and qualifications and recommends that the contract be awarded to the low bidder.

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby

RESOLVED, that the Authority hereby accepts the bid in the amount of \$282,750.00 of O’Connell Electric Company, Inc. and, subject to the review and approval of the Authority’s engineer and counsel, authorizes the Chairman and/or Chief Executive Officer to execute contracts and other documentation in connection therewith.
