Management's focus in 2022 was to continue its efforts to collect sewer fees it was owed by various entities. The Authority worked with Rensselaer County on a \$1.5 million New York State Legislative grant to extend the existing sewer line along Maple Hill Road in the Town of Schodack out to State Route 9. Additionally, the Authority is working with the Town of North Greenbush on the hook-up of 36 future apartments to its Valley View Boulevard.
